WHY ARE THERE SO MANY ENGLISH BIBLE TRANSLATIONS?

ANSWERING YOUR QUESTIONS - BY PASTOR NATHAN POTTS



I'm often asked the question about different Bible translations. Questions such as; Which is the closest to the original text? or Which English translation is the most literal translation? or Are our modern translations to be trusted?

These are all great questions as it shows a desire for searching the Scriptures with diligence and discernment.

Our first English translation was published by William Tyndale in 1525. Tyndale was martyred for his faith in 1536 as the religious elite attempted to get rid of the English translation of the bible. By 1611 King James had authorized the printing and publication of the King James Bible (KJB). The KJV is an excellent translation compiled by a committee of 54 scholars with skill in the original languages. This committee also leaned heavily on other English translations such as the Geneva Bible (1557), Bishops Bible (1568), Tyndale (1525), The Great Bible (1539) Coverdale Bible (1535).

All these translations are literal and formal in their translation philosophy based on the available texts of the time¹.

ANSWERING YOUR QUESTIONS

In the last 100-years most new English translations apply the "Critical text" as the basis for interpretation. The critical text takes the oldest manuscripts and most difficult readings as being the most accurate from all three sources². Two major translation philosophies have also been applied.

- Formal equivalence word for word translation.
- 2. Dynamic equivalence phrase by phrase translation. A method that prioritizes conveying the meaning and impact of a source text on its target audience, rather than strictly adhering to the source text's wording and structure. It aims for a natural-sounding translation that resonates with the target reader in a similar way the original text resonated with its audience.

Examples of modern translations that apply formal equivalence are: New American Standard Bible (NASB, 1971), English Standard Bible (ESV, 2001), New English

Translation (NET, 2005), Legacy Standard Bible (LSB, 2024). The reading of these texts can seem somewhat "wooden" and slightly removed from everyday language.

Examples of dynamic equivalence translations are: New International Version (NIV, 1978), Today's New International Version (TNIV, 2005), New Living Translation (NLT, 1996). These texts are easier to read but can become interpretive by nature.

All these translations can be trusted as the truths of God's word are evident in both translating philosophies. I would encourage everyone who studies God's word to have two or three of these different translations before them as they study. Insights will be gained through different wording and concepts.

The LORD's precepts are fair and make one joyful. The LORD's commands are pure and give insight for life. (Psalms 19:8 NET)

This document was compiled by the Catholic theologian and humanist – Erasmus of Rotterdam. During this translation period the translators had not been aware of the three distinct text-types or families of NT texts. (1) Alexandrian (Egypt), (2) Western (Roman Empire), (3) Byzantine (Asia Minor and Greece).

THE GOSPEL OF GRACE

No other letter in the New Testament commands more attention with relation to the definition of the gospel than Paul's letter to the Romans. As Pastor Chuck Swindoll says in his commentary on Romans, "From Origen of Alexandria in the third century to Barnhouse of Philadelphia in the twentieth, countless theologians will pen innumerable pages of exposition and meditation on the apostle's magnum opus... (it) will spark a revolution in the heart of Martin Luther, who will reintroduce the truth of justification by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone."

This letter expounds and defends the gospel that comes as a gift of God's grace. Paul explains that his very apostleship is by God's grace (Romans 1:5). When as believers we place our faith in Christ we are justified by God's grace through faith (3:24; 5:2). Sin has entered this world through Adam and sin reigns because we all die, but God's grace reigns through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ (5:21). As believers we now live under grace and not the law, therefore sin is no longer our master (6:14). It is also by grace that all believers receive gifts for ministry to serve others (12:16).

The gospel is God's saving work as a gift of His grace accomplished by the work of Jesus our Lord. This gospel reveals the righteousness of God, the grace of God and the love of God through his sovereign will in all matters of salvation. His mercy is immeasurable and his one and only Son is put forward as the atoning sacrifice for sin. *Oh, what grace!*

This gift of grace through Jesus Christ our Lord is the only thing that deals with the effects of human sin. Christ's righteousness becomes our righteousness; our sin becomes Christ's sin in this great substitutionary exchange. *Oh, what grace!*

God empowers the believer through the indwelling Holy Spirit transforming us by his grace. Grace strengthens on a daily basis and it is this grace that truly sets us free. God's grace is inexhaustible and is truly amazing.



CELEBRATING WITH

As I drove to my friends' house, I recall thinking out loud to my family that it was a most unusual party we were to attend. My friends, a wonderful couple, were celebrating the homecoming of their son, who had been paroled after seven long years in prison. While he was guilty of the charges against him, the sentence he received was extraordinarily harsh when compared to the crimes of other inmates. No matter. He was home. And his exuberance for life energized everyone around him. The experience that so often hardens men and turns them bitter had refined and softened this young man. What emerged from the crucible of prison was a serenely repentant, mellow, humbly grateful child of God.

He spoke freely of his experiences, beginning with the moment the judge accepted the jury's verdict and slammed the gavel down. As everyone else gathered their belongings and headed for the parking lot, he was led through a side door and then placed inside

a cage. Next, he was stripped, searched, photographed, printed, shackled, and then put aboard a tan prison bus. For the next seven years, he bore the title "convict," and for rest of his life, he will be called "ex-con" or "felon."

As I reflect on this young man's experience, I must ask myself, "How are he and I different?" There are several differences. His record of wrongdoing is a matter of public record; mine is locked away in heaven. He suffered punishment most can scarcely imagine; I will not endure a single moment of retribution for my wrongs. The world will forever count him the least among its citizens; I am unjustly celebrated. "Where then is boasting? It is excluded" (Romans 3:27)! For the felon and I are more alike than different. My heart is no less depraved than his—or yours. Earthly courts saw fit to place him behind bars, but you and I are no less guilty before our almighty Judge. Truth be told, you and I deserve far worse.

MY FELLOW FELON

CAN WE BOAST, THEN, THAT WE HAVE DONE ANYTHING TO BE ACCEPTED BY GOD? NO, BECAUSE OUR ACQUITTAL IS NOT BASED ON OBEYING THE LAW. IT IS BASED ON FAITH. SO WE ARE MADE RIGHT WITH GOD THROUGH FAITH AND NOT BY OBEYING THE LAW.

Romans 3:27-28

Therefore, if we dare boast in the presence of my paroled friend, let us boast with him. Let us join him in bragging on Jesus Christ and His inexplicable gift of grace. Let us see ourselves as his equals, paroled felons enjoying undeserved freedom. For "where then is boasting?" Not with us. Not in our goodness. And may I remind you once again? Salvation is a gift, and this gift demonstrates the goodness of the Giver, not of those who receive it.

For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard. Yet God, in his grace, freely makes us right in his sight. He did this through Christ Jesus when he freed us from the penalty for our sins. For God presented Jesus as the sacrifice for sin. People are made right with God when they believe that Jesus sacrificed his life, shedding his blood. (Romans 3:23–25)
